CATEGORIES

BEST SHARD - Sea Glass- rated on color, identifiable markings, shape and general "coolness"!!!

BEST BEANER- This award goes to whomever can find the most sea beans on the 14th and 15th. Judging will be at the end of the day on the 15th. There isn't a lot out there right now so get all you can!!

BEST BEAN- Goes to the coolest sea bean found during the Symposium. Can be any species, it just has to be cool!!!

TURTLE SAVIOR AWARD- Goes to whomever collects the most Plastic off of the beaches starting on OCTOBER 14 and goes until OCTOBER 15. Bring it to the Symposium for judging the amount. Get a team together.

BEST BEACH COLLECTION- Goes to the favorite odd beach collection. See Odd Collection Contest.

What? This can be anything you collect on the beach. Barrettes? Tackle? Lighters? Sea Heros? Anything goes!!! We want to see what you collect!!!!


When? Submit your entries anytime during the weekend before the judging on Saturday PM.
